Scott Robertson holds the degrees of Master of the Built Environment (Building Conservation) and Bachelor of Architecture (Honours), both from the University of New South Wales, Sydney, Australia and is currently enrolled for a PhD centred on traditional Javanese architecture.

He has over 30 years' experience as an architect in private practice, involved in projects ranging from residential alterations and additions, new houses and small commercial and institutional projects as well as heritage projects. As a heritage architect, he has been involved in projects ranging from conservation management plans, major research projects and the design, documentation and contract administration of a range of conservation building projects. Two major studies were the interwar housing study for the National Trust of Australia in 1993 to 1996 and the recent award-winning study for the NSW Heritage Office on sites used in NSW during the two world wars.

Scott is the founding president of Docomomo Australia, the Australian branch of an international organisation. Docomomo was founded in the Netherlands and now headquartered in Paris, concerned with the documentation and conservation of buildings and areas of modern architecture.
