Anne E. Weber, FAIA, is a Senior Associate with Farewell Mills Gatsch Architects in Princeton, NJ. Her practice consists primarily of managing large-scale institutional historic preservation projects such as the restoration of the Princeton University Chapel, and Louis Kahn's Trenton Bath Houses. Ms. Weber has served on the Board of Directors of the Association for Preservation Technology since 2003, co-chairing the Publications Committee. Ms. Weber, a licensed architect, holds a B.S. in Engineering and Applied Science from Yale University, and an M.Arch. and an M.S. in Historic Preservation from Columbia University. Ms. Weber also attended the Attingham Summer School. She was the first recipient of the Charles Peterson Prize from the Historic American Buildings Survey and AIA in 1983. She has previously worked for the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, and at private architectural firms in Virginia and Mississippi.
